Be a blessing, share our blessings and count our blessings all power up gratitude in our lives. Thankfulness isn't an "ego-stroking, let me feel better because it is all about me" action - being grateful opens our hearts to realize all we do have and then share these gifts from God with others.



The challenge I am doing this month and I invite you to join me is this: Make a list of as many of your blessings as you can think of - then intentionally share them with others.

REMINDER: Trinity's Weather Cancellation/Closure Policy is that if Williams County or the City of Bryan are on a Level 1 Travel Advisory, programing at the church will continue as planned with the

Level 3 Travel Advisory allows only emergency personnel to be on the roads, therefore, the church will be closed.

To see or hear about closures, watch any of the major Toledo television stations, (Channel 11, 13 and 24,) Fort Wayne's Channel 15, or listen to WBCL, WBNO, WLZZ radio stations. Pastor Mary Beth tries to get that information posted and broadcast as soon as a decision is made regarding weather related church cancellations or closure.

Nominating Committee/Council Elections:

P8.02

<u>Current</u> - In addition to the candidates submitted by the nominating committee, nominations may be made from the floor when the ballot is presented to the congregation on a Sunday in October. The congregation is to be informed of which Sunday that will be at least one (1) week ahead of time by announcement at a worship service or by written notice

<u>Change to</u> - "In addition to the candidates submitted by the nominating committee, nominations may be made from the floor when the ballot is presented to the congregation on a <u>Saturday and Sunday</u> in October. The congregation is to be informed of which <u>Saturday and Sunday</u> that will be at least one (1) week ahead of time by announcement at a worship service or by written notice.

Annual Meeting

<u>Current</u> - The annual meeting of the congregation shall be held on a Sunday in January. Notice of the meeting shall be given as in P5.01

Change to - The annual meeting of the congregation shall be convened in 2 parts, with Part 1 convening and acting on the reports and budget on a Saturday in January, and Part 2 convening and acting on reports and budget on a Sunday in January, after which the meeting will be formally adjourned. All ballots submitted at either meeting (Part 1 or Part 2) will be taken into account for the final determination of any decisions by the whole congregation. A roster of those voting will be recorded to prevent any accidental casting of more than one ballot by any member. Notice of the meeting shall be given as in P5.01
