First Day of Spring March 20, 2022 I've followed the crowd and joined the participants in the new online game called "Wordle." The goal is to stimulate brain cells to function, but the reality is increased frustration with my lack of ability to come up with 5 letter words, only one of which is the mystery word of the day. Rachel got me started on the game when I expressed to her a concern about growing older and more absent minded. Now I am addicted, the only upside being that I can blame her.

Anyhow, about the game. Each day players are given up to 6 chances to correctly guess the word. Each guess reveals either correct or incorrect letters, some of them already placed appropriately in the word, others simply part of the word but not in the right spot. Do you know how many 5 letter words are part of the English lexicon? Far more words than my limited mental functioning has access to. Rachel advised me that she starts each puzzle with specific words, each with a few consonants and a couple of vowels. So I did likewise. Each puzzle I begin with my favorite 5 letter words, each with a few consonants and a couple of vowels - GRACE, FAITH, DOUBT, LOVED, MERCY, SAVED....you get the idea.

That daily puzzle has me wondering how many words we use in our daily vocabulary which reflect our Christian beliefs? I can come up with lots of them. Add Biblical people's names to the mix and we have even more: JESUS, MOSES, SARAH, PETER, JAMES, LYDIA.

What really important words shape your Christian witness? For a long time mine was shaped more by words which pointed out my sinful nature - words like GUILTY or SINNER or BROKEN or CONDEMNED - none of which are 5 letter words. I had to train my brain to work in a specific way to search for 5 letter words. That's part of learning to capably navigate the puzzle.

It's also part of learning to navigate life as a witness to the One who is Love in the flesh, who's steadfast mercy includes the whole human family. JESUS. Think on it - without Him we can't be WHOLE or FOUND. That friends is GRACE upon GRACE and GRACE ALONE.

Worship Focus for March

Narch 5 & 6 First Weekend in Lent

These forty days called Lent are like no other. It is our opportune time to return to the God who rescues, to receive the gifts of God's grace, to believe with the heart and confess with the mouth the wonder of God's love in Jesus, and to resist temptation at every turn. This is no small pilgrimage on which we have just embarked. It is a struggle Jesus knew. It is a struggle Jesus shares. The nearness of the Lord, in bread and wine, water and word, will uphold and sustain us.

March 12 & 13 Second Weekend in Lent

Though we sometimes doubt and often resist God's desire to protect and save us, our God persists. In holy baptism, God's people have been called and gathered into a God-initiated relationship that will endure. Lent provides the church with a time and a tradition in which to seek God's face again. Lent provides another occasion to behold the God of our salvation in the face of the Blessed One who "comes in the name of the Lord."

March 19 & 20 Third Weekend in Lent

The warnings are plentiful and blunt on the third Sunday in Lent. Cut it out or get cut down! The warnings are accompanied by God's invitation to attentiveness: "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live." The landowner's ultimatum is forestalled by the gardener's readiness to till the ground one more year. That is good news for all of us. Thanks be to God!

March 26 & 27 Fourth Weekend in Lent

The psalm sets the tone this day: "Happy are they whose transgressions are forgiven, and whose sin is put away!" Happy are those who have "become the righteousness of God" in the merits of Christ Jesus. Happy are those for whom the forgiveness of God has "rolled away... the disgrace" of former times. Happy is the father at the return of his prodigal son. Happy are we that our sins are forgiven for Jesus' sake. Rejoice!

"Making Change" Change is a constant in our lives. Some changes mark gradual transitions, as when daytime shifts toward twilight or winter turns to spring. Others happen in the blink of an eye, separating time into "before" and "after". We choose to undergo some changes after carefully considering our options, while others are forced upon us.

In the weeks, days, and hours before Jesus' crucifixion, the disciples also experienced change: a change of venue as the gates of Jerusalem approached; a change of plans as their long-awaited Messiah was arrested and tried; a change of circumstance as the crowds shouted "Crucify!"

Change is hard. We long for the expected and familiar, but all too often find ourselves in the midst of uncertainty and the unknown. We cannot predict how things will turn out. The hymnwriter Joachim Neander proclaimed God's steadfast love in the midst of life's inevitable changes: "All my hope on God is founded who will all my trust renew, who through change and chance will guide me, only good and only true. God unknown, God alone, call my heart to be thine own" (ELW 757).

Our Lenten season, which begins with Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022 and concludes with Holy Week, April 10-16, 2022. Each week we will gather for worship on Wednesdays, with the Bryan congregations alternating between Trinity and First Lutheran, and weekly services each Wednesday evening at St. Peter's, Edon. The schedule is as follows:

Ash Wednesday, March 2 - Holy Communion with Imposition of Ashes. 12 Noon at Trinity and 7 p.m. at First Lutheran and St. Peter's, Edon.

Wednesday, March 9 - Change of Seasons 7 p.m. at Trinity "For everything there is a season." We hear those familiar words telling us that life is full of changes. Jesus' parables are also filled with images of life transformed. Just as the mustard seed grows into a tree or yeast turns flour into bread, we too are called to be agents of change in the kingdom of God. Christ did not come to earth to maintain the status quo, but rather to usher in a change of season. Scripture: Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 and Luke 13:18-21.

Wednesday, March 16 - Change of Circumstances 7 p.m. at First Lutheran. We move from elementary to middle school, or from our hometown to a new community. We lose a job, or gain a child, or accomplish a goal, or relinquish a dream. Through it all, we learn to give thanks to God in all circumstances. Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 5:12-24 and Luke 12:22-34.

Wednesday, March 23 - Change of Habits 7 p.m. at Trinity. Bad habits are hard to break. The letter to the Galatians urges us to replace them with the fruits of the Spirit. Love, patience, generosity, and self-control are just some of the good habits practiced by those whose foundation is built on Christ. Scripture: Galatians 5:16-25 and Luke 6:46-49.

Wednesday, March 30 - Change of Plans 7 p.m. at First Lutheran. God's ways are not our own. We expect a conquering king and hero, but Jesus instead leads us down the road to Jerusalem and humbles himself on the cross. God changes our plans and replaces them with a love broader and deeper than anything we could imagine. Scripture: Isaiah 52:13-15 and Mark 10:32-34.

Wednesday, April 6 - Change of Heart 7 p.m. at Trinity. Jesus' words to the Pharisees give us pause: "You honor me with your lips, but your hearts are far from me." Jesus invites us to experience a change of heart that will in fact change every part of our lives. Scripture: Ezekiel 36:22-28 and Mark 7:1-8, 14-15 and 21-23.

March is a season of change and so is the time of Lent. Change will be the theme for many of our Sundays and Wednesday evening Lenten services this year.

Wise Words

I don't think I am alone admitting change is hard. I get comfortable in knowing the expected routines, the predictability of what will occur next and the relishing my false sense of control of life without the upheaval of change. The Greek philosopher Heraclitus said that "change is the only

constant in life." It means that the world is always changing. So is life. So are our circumstances. So are people. Some change occurs slowly over time like the dawn's morning light coming sooner in spring and days lasting longer. Others happen abruptly like losing an hour of sleep with the time change or an unexpected diagnosis or loss. We choose some changes in life, but many others arrived uninvited.

Change naturally disrupts us and may bring fear and anxiety but transformation also signals growth and adventure into discovery, creativity, and growing grace and love. Instead of a dreaded threat, change can be an invitation of promise and blessing. We walk with God and take the next steps in faith and trust. God is our strong foundation in times of peace and joy and in moments of turbulent change. His word guides us through uncertainty.


