Pilgrimage Ponderings

What are your favorite Easter traditions? Is it the Lamb shaped, chocolate cake with a cooked, fluffy icing sprinkled generously with cocoanut? Is it gathering with the family, in the family pew for worship and enjoying the Easter breakfast after? Is it a family Easter egg hunt - moved inside on occasion because of unpredictable spring weather? Is it the shopping trip for a new spring dress and the reminiscing of Easter bonnets and lacy gloves and white patent leather Mary Jane shoes?

My favorite Easter tradition is the singing of triumphant Easter hymns. All those repetitions of the word "Alleluia!" The word is familiar to people of Judeo-Christian traditions worldwide, and it is customary to forbid it's use through the season of Lent so that the impact of those Easter proclamations is more profound. The word has its roots in the Hebrew scriptures of the Old Testament in which the word, "Hallel" means Praise, and the word "Jah" means God. We've anglicized it to become Alleluia, but the words Hallelujah and Alleluia are interchangeable and mean the same thing. Praise God.

On Easter we break the Alleluia out of it's Lenten grave just like Jesus was freed from the grave on that first Easter morning. When he was first seen by Mary, in the light of dawn in a resurrection body, her first words were probably not "Praise God." They would have been more human - like, "Am I seeing things?" "Who are you?" The record in Matthew, Mark and Luke find the woman, including Mary speechless. According to John's Gospel account, we are told that Mary asked about Jesus' whereabouts when she discovered the stone rolled away and the tomb empty. She also declared him her teacher. The words Praise God aren't the first human response but they are a response which gains momentum when considering all that has gone into the situation. They are words of perspective and history and hope and trust.

To say it's time to break forth with sounds of perspective, history, hope and trust is an understatement. Easter this year should include Champaign toasts, helium filled balloons, joy unspeakable and hope only resurrection life can provide. We have endured a Good Friday and Holy Saturday called CoronaVirus and our Resurrection is evident. I encourage you to consider how you will celebrate the full joy of the Easter season as a response in Praise of God. I encourage those who have yet to re-connect with the congregation to consider making a commitment to being in worship on Easter Sunday, and there in experience the fullness of joy which only comes through new life in Christ. I encourage you to take the message of Christ, spoken first to the women at the tomb, to your friends and family, co-workers and neighbors, "Christ is alive!"



WORSHIP FOCUS FOR APRIL

April 2 & 3 Fifth Weekend of Lent

Our God makes all things new. In the first reading God promises it. In the gospel Mary anticipates it, anointing Jesus' feet with costly perfume in preparation for the day of his burial. In the second reading Paul recalls his transformation from the persecutor Saul into an apostle. In baptism, God's new person (you!) rises daily from the deadly mire of trespasses and sins.

§ 10 Passion / Palm Weekend

Today we follow Christ from triumphal entry to the cross, each waypoint of the journey marked by Jesus' compassion for those who would betray, mock, accuse, or do violence to him. Though persecuted and beaten, Jesus the Son of God is not disgraced; instead, he asks forgiveness for those who put him to death. We have walked the Lenten pathway these forty days, each of us invited through baptism to "let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus." We enter this holy week accompanying Jesus to the cross with both grief and thanksgiving in our hearts, trusting in God's redeeming love.

April 16 & 17 Easter Vigil & Resurrection of Our Lord

"The last enemy to be destroyed is death," Paul writes. Today Christ is risen, and we gather together with astonishment and joy. Christ is risen, and we have been set free from the bonds of death. Christ is risen, and we are forgiven. Christ is risen, and with the women at the tomb and Peter, we are amazed. Let us rejoice: Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

April 23 & 24 Second Weekend of Easter

In spite of all we have heard and all we have seen, it is often hard to believe. Because it is hard to believe, we will invest ourselves in the Easter mystery for fifty days (a week of weeks). Because it is hard to believe, John the evangelist will provide sign after sign celebrating Jesus' victory over death. Because it is hard to believe, the risen Jesus will return to us again and again in the mystery of holy communion, inviting us to touch and taste his presence, and offering us his peace.

We are fortunate as a congregation to have a scholarship fund that can be of assistance to our people who are pursuing additional education beyond




