### <u>Pilgrimage Ponderings</u>

Every year, in the Sundays after Easter, when we hear through the scripture readings about the post-resurrection appearances of Jesus, I have to remind myself that his physical appearance is not what it was before the crucifixion. At the very least, his body bears the scars of the wounds suffered by Roman spear to his side and nails puncturing his hands and feet. That is a significant recollection. It gives me hope in my own wounded existence.

There is no way, having experienced various life situations, we can get through mortal existence without a few scars. Those scars mark us as mortal and sometimes help others to see us as human and vulnerable.

A favorite author, Henri Nouwen, in his book "The Wounded Healer" acknowledges that it is because of our wounds and our scars that we often find connection with one another. Wounds and scars create empathy - an ability to relate to another from a position of similar experience, solidarity, emotionally, socially, psychologically, spiritually.


I remember when I became a single mother after divorce that I was forced into a demographic of women with whom I really had no previous connection, but with whom suddenly I understood the various realities experienced only by single mothers. Childcare concerns, sick-days with sick children, lonely sleepless nights of worry with no one to share concerns, financial realities, home ownership burdens. All of those situations left me with a few wounds and scars. Those situations left me better able to connect with single moms who are trying to be everything for everyone.

Increasingly I believe that the opportunity to claim our corporate scars and wounds, and by their evidence and life learnings, reach out to the larger community as Jesus' hands and feet is truly the best posture of the Church. We embody the promise that our mortality is a gift and that by our wounds we can connect with the wounded neighbor. It doesn't matter is your wound is emotional, physical, spiritual, social....there is a neighbor who needs to know that you've survived and that you have found hope and peace in Christ.

That's the good news of the bodily resurrection of Jesus, who willingly shows his hands, feet and side to a questioning disciple and who doesn't criticize the question, but by the exposure of wounds invites faith in something beyond the woundedness. It's the good news of women with broken hearts restored by the love of a redeemer who meets them in their despair and commissions them to share a new ending to the story - that death is not the end, but rather a new beginning, that wounds heal and hope will prevail.

How about you - where are you wounded and how have those wounds, now healed, become a gift for speaking of Jesus' life, His love, the gift of hope and the promise of joy. Share it - with bold proclamation - and in so doing experience the true meaning of resurrection.

### Wise Words



Prayer involves deep listening to God. One way I hear God is through reading scriptures, faith related books, music, and poetry. If I pay attention, I sense when a word or phrase resonates in my heart, tickles my spirit, makes me curious with wonder, and wakes me up.

Lately the poetry by Mary Oliver echoes in my soul. This poem by Mary Oliver made me laugh out loud and so me when I get full of 'poor me" syndrome. What a great image to remember and remind

us that just showing up daily to the present task at hand is often our next right step.

"I go down to the shore in the morning And depending on the hour the waves Are rolling in or moving out, And I say, oh, I am miserable, What shall -What should I do? And the seas says In its lovely voice:

Excuse me, I have work to do."

Even as I type this poem weeks later, I smile. God gently tells me it is not all about me, quit the self-pity and get to back to the work he has called me to.

Another of her lines is this: "Joy is not made to be a crumb." Wow, what a great reminder of the God of delight and blessings all around us if we seek him.

One of Mary Oliver's most famous questions is this: "Tell me, what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?" These words invite me to come again to God, with an open and willing heart to serve and obey.

And when the news gets me anxious and I become uneasy and fearful seeing photos of war and injustice, I come to God with his Word: Be still and know I am God. (Psalm 46). I pray these words slowly with each inhale and exhale, settling into God's arms of love and grace. Listening to God. Being with God.


