Pilgrimage Ponderings

With summer beginning and life bringing some adventures with family and fun activities outside, it's also time to change up the worship service. Therefore, beginning with Pentecost Weekend, June 4 & 5, 2022, we will alter the liturgy for the summer months. At first the order of worship will seem unfamiliar, so let me explain a few of the key elements.

The Thanksgiving for Baptism will be replaced with a gathering hymn. The gathering hymn will be a joyful and upbeat hymn to call us together into the praise of Jesus. Because opinions have been voiced that too much singing too close together in the service is not a preference, we will move from the hymn to the greeting and prayer of the day. The children's message and first scripture reading will follow. A new element will be the gospel acclamation, which during the summer will be the hymn, "Halle, Halle, Hallelujah!" from the blue With One Voice hymnal. The Gospel and Sermon will precede the hymn of the day...after that is where things will seem unfamiliar.

The unfamiliar part will be an intentional joining of the Confession of Sin and the Apostle's Creed, which I am titling The Rite of Reconciliation & Profession of Faith. It is appropriately placed in the service so that as we move toward the Sacrament of Holy Communion we have been reconciled with God and each other and have heard words of absolution. The Prayers of Intercession will precede the sacrament, as they do normally.

Following the meal of Holy Communion we will hear words of blessing and sending, including the sending hymn. The synod memory verse will be re-introduced too.

Worship should be renewing and encouraging so that we are filled up with the faith, hope peace and joy of Christ. When we leave worship, we are sent into the world where we will pour that faith, hope, peace and joy out as we live in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Feedback is always welcome. We are in this together - in service to Christ and one another, always!

June 4 & 5 Day of Pentecost

June 11 & 12 The Holy Trinity

"O LORD our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!" Today we celebrate the holy Trinity. Paul writes that through Jesus we have peace with God, whose love pours into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, giving us lasting hope. We celebrate the gracious One-in-Three, eternal Three-in-One, as we worship in community; as we share water and word, bread and wine; and as we bring God's love and hope to our neighbors.

June 18 & 19 Second Weekend after Pentecost

This Sunday's texts paint startling pictures of the horrific nature of sin. The church's repeated celebration of holy communion counters that tragic reality in a continued showing forth of the death of Jesus until he comes again. It is a dramatic declaration of "how much God has done for you."

June 25 & 26 Third Weekend after Pentecost

We have no good apart from God. That makes Jesus' call to follow him an invitation to freedom. This is freedom to revel in the Spirit's fruit: love, joy, peace, and patience. This is freedom to not be imprisoned by anything that would keep us from the fullness of the life God has given us. This is the path of life. Wise Words

Summer has arrived and so do those delicious strawberries. Some people call them "nature's candy." Strawberries are the first fruit to ripen this time of year. What a delicious entrance to announce that we are now in the season of summer. Enjoy eating this fruit, but also pause and really look, wonder, and prayerfully consider something as simple as the strawberry.

What a gift from God! Did you know strawberries are mentioned in the Bible? In the Message version, Psalm 19:10 reads: "God's Word is better than a diamond, better than a diamond set between emeralds. You'll like it better than strawberries in spring, better than red, ripe strawberries."

God is so creative - look at his artistry in designing the strawberry. The average strawberry has 200 seeds. Examine its rich red color and decorative green hat. Strawberries' deep green leaves, the color of life, grow in clusters of three, symbolic of the Trinity. They produce dainty white flowers, symbolic of the purity of Jesus' life, that grow into beautiful heart-shaped red fruit, symbolic of the love of God. Strawberries need to stay on the vine to fully ripen. We too need to abide in God on His vine to become all God has created us to be.

Strawberries have been associated with goodness and purity in Christian history. The strawberry was once a symbol of the Virgin Mary. In paintings of Mary, many artists used strawberries in the detail of the picture or as a border.

On June 14, the full moon will rise and is called the "Strawberry Moon." This name has been used by Algonquin, Ojibwe, Dakota, and Lakota peoples to mark the ripening of "June-bearing" strawberries that are ready to be gathered.

The smallest, simplest of things can remind us of life's most profound teachings. Take a moment to appreciate the little things in life - all gifts from God. Simple treats such as the strawberry.
