Pilgrimage Ponderings

I am writing this brief missal to the Parish as I prepare for a week of vacation, camping with my husband. As I prepare for that time away, I am also trying to wrap up all kinds of loose ends regarding stuff for the congregations and programs which need to be communicated now rather than later. I am also juggling a few pastoral care concerns and a funeral yesterday and a wedding this weekend. I don't share this with you all to justify my call, but to say that we all have lots going on, lots of demands for our time and expectations from all sorts of directions. Acknowledging that reality, shared and common and sometimes overwhelming, also acknowledges the gift of sabbath, intended for creation and modeled by our Creator. Sabbath renews, restores, and refreshes. God took a break on the 7^{th} day, and so should those created in God's image.


As such I want to share a bit about my sabbath practice. With very few exceptions - pastoral emergencies and wedding rehearsals - my weekly day off is Friday. On Fridays I can be found with my phone on mute (meaning that text messages, emails and calls are often not received promptly.) I have even begun to take off my smartwatch so that those notifications don't buzz on my wrist. I don't set an alarm. I linger over my coffee and enjoy a longer time of reading and prayer. I do the things I want to do rather than the things that need to be done. I bake on Fridays when turning on the oven won't amplify the outside temperature. I, with rare

exceptions, inform Jeff that we will be dining out or getting carry out or he will be cooking our supper. And, if it's baseball season, I relish watching the ENTIRE game of baseball from the comfort of my home with my favorite beverage and snack. Because Friday is spent that way, and in order to have some order in the rest of my week, that often results in a partial day off on another weekday.

Often Thursday mid-afternoon and evening is my pre-sabbath. I grocery shop, do a couple of loads of laundry and clean the house. To accomplish these things makes my sabbath less stressful. Admittedly, sometimes the concerns of vocation and life can't be neatly contained within the calendar boxes of each day and week and month. But the goal of sabbath and its benefit is worthy to pursue.

How do you spend your sabbath? Do you make time for even longer times of vacation...a 7 times the 7th day kind of sabbath? I truly believe and, the longer I live, know that to practice sabbath permits us to celebrate the intended order of Creator in relationship to creature and creation. God gifted us with the invitation to BE, and that gives us permission to say no to the human compulsion to DO. For me to understand that and allow it to seep deeply into my spirit, I meditate on Matthew 11:28-30, in which Jesus says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

WISE WORDS

"Pay attention to what I say; turn your ear to my words. Do not let them out of your sight, keep them within your heart; for they are life to those who find them and health to one's whole body." Proverbs 4:20b-22 (NIV)

Paying attention. Noticing when, how, and what God is inviting us into is an essential spiritual discipline all of us need to practice. God is all around, never leaving us - we don't see the divine because of our inattentiveness.

"Americans are losing their ability to focus. For me, I am finding it harder to concentrate and read for longer periods of time. A recent study showed found college students could focus only on one task for 65 seconds. A different study of office workers found they only focus on average for three minutes. This isn't happening because we all individually became weak-willed or lazy. Society, information-overload, and social media are making it difficult for our human brains to pay attention. I want to really pay attention. I need to listen to what God is saying. I bet most of you want to do this too. How do we hear God? How can we best study the Word of God when we can't concentrate? How can paying attention bring us closer to God to be shaped by God?

One way I approach scripture is to look for one verse I can savor word by word, letting it sink in deeply — interrupting me, rearranging me, redirecting me. I slow down, savoring each word, phrase and paying attention to what stirs within my heart. Pausing after I pay attention guides me and focuses my next steps. We don't have to get overwhelmed with the enormity and depth of the Bible. It's okay if we read just a verse or two. But more importantly than reading His words, we must choose to receive them. And even more importantly, we must live them. Because the more we apply God's teaching to our lives, the more it becomes part of us.

Other ways to pay attention is to be fully present in each moment, study something long enough to learn something new about it, look at something familiar with a fresh perspective, be available, be aware, wait with expectancy, be mindful, and be wakeful. Make it your goal to see God in all things, and all things in God.

Dear Lord, help me to pay attention You today in a single word or a single verse. You are all-powerful, and anything is possible through You. May Your words and Your truth seep into the plans I make and every thought I think today. In Jesus' Name, Amen.



Synod Assembly Report on Friday, June 3, Deacon Jeanie, Pastor Mary Beth and First Lutheran members Dave & Jan Schumm represented out Parish at the Northwestern Ohio Synod Assembly. Held at BGSU, the event included the re-election of Bishop Daniel Beaudoin to a second 6 year term on the first ballot. The assembly elected Nancy Yunker as the synod vice-president, and also elected voting members for synod council and various committees of the synod. The 300+ voting members also approved a synod spending plan for 2023 & 2024. Additionally the assembly acted to pass resolutions on use of Non-Disclosure/Non-Disparagements agreements, the On-Leave from Call Process, and Gun Violence. All of these resolutions also became memorials to be brought before the churchwide assembly voting

members who will meet in August 2022 in Columbus, Ohio. Those resolutions and memorials are available to read and are posted on the bulletin board in the church. Synod assembly acted to approve Compensation Guidelines for Rostered Leaders for 2023 and 2024.

The time at BGSU wasn't all business, assembly goers also participated in delightful "StoryWalk" conversations and times of reflection were shared and uplifting worship kept the gathering focused on the gift of a Loving God and the Empowering Spirit of Christ.


