Pilgrimage Ponderings

4 years ago this month we began an adventure of faith by becoming known as the Williams County ELCA Parish. It was an adventure with a few years of planning and imagining behind it, honest conversations and real considerations of the situation each congregation faced with declining attendance and financial support, paired with a lack of ability to support a full-time called, rostered leader if one were available. You might have an opinion different than mine, but I think that adventure of faith has been very worthwhile and blessed by God.

Evidence of that blessing of God was on display when we gathered for the most recent parish worship service and fellowship meal hosted by St. Peter's on July 31. The day was glorious for praising God and the Holy Spirit showed up in a comfortably full church, with people of all ages in attendance. Special music, Holy Communion, the word of God read from scripture and proclaimed in spoken voice and song, lifted worshippers who had come from all 3 parish congregations.

The meal was wonderful - tasty, smoked pulled pork and sloppy joe sandwiches provided by the host congregation, were accompanied by flavorful salads and sweet desserts provided by First and Trinity members. Conversations across the table, laughter, repeated comments about how wonderful the service was or the food was or the day was, were heard for over an hour of fellowship.

What we have done in the past 4 years is make connections - that word is being used more frequently in all kinds of contexts in the parish. We are making connections through the joint parish worship services and fellowship meals, but we are also connecting in care through Trinity's Loaves & Fish 2.0 meal ministry; we are connecting in music with the First & Trinity Handbell Choir; we are connecting in learning through the Parish Catechism Class, and more connections are being considered. I like that emphasis of connecting - it's what God did in a very intentional way when Jesus came among people like you and me. He connected in worship with his tradition, he connected in service with compassion, he connected in learning by teaching his followers how a life lived in faith connects one to God and to each other.

In this newsletter you will find a "Connection-aire" which has been carefully prepared to determine the direction of some of the existing or struggling connections within the Parish and the congregations. Your input is vital to the future we all share as we continue this adventure of faith. Please respond and return your "Connection-aire" to the box in the narthex by September 30, 2022. Thank you!

September 4

13th Sunday after Pentecost

Called to contemplate the cost of discipleship, we might be helped by translating Paul's request to Philemon into our prayer of the day: Refresh my heart in Christ. Strengthened by the company and forgiveness of Christ in holy communion and recalling God's grace in remembrance of baptism, we can be strengthened in this hour to "choose life"—to choose life in God as our own.

14th Weekend after Pentecost

The grumbling of the religious leaders in today's gospel is actually our holy hope: This Jesus welcomes sinners and eats with them. That our God seeks and saves the lost is not only a holy hope, it is our only hope. As the writer of 1 Timothy reminds us, "The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." Thanks be to God.

September 17 & 18

15th Weekend after Pentecost

As we are invited today to consider what it means to be managers (rather than owners) of all that we have, it is crucial to recognize that we are bought with a price. "Christ Jesus, himself human, . . . gave himself a ransom for all." Apart from the generosity of God we have nothing—we are nothing. By God's gracious favor we have everything we need.

September 24 & 25

16th Weekend after Pentecost

Consideration of and care for those in need (especially those "at our gate," visible to us, of whom we are aware) is an essential component of good stewardship. It is in the sharing of wealth that we avoid the snare of wealth. It is the one whom death could not hold—who comes to us risen from the dead—who can free us from the death grip of greed.

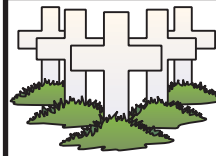

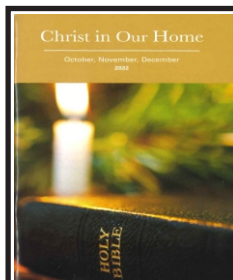


Would there be any interest in a roadtrip to Blue Gate Theatre, Shipshewana

Wise Words

Happy New Year! Confused? Well, it is not really a new calendar year nor even a new church year yet, but September is often referred to as the beginning of a new year. Whether we are returning to school or not, fall brings a renewed energy to learn, to get something done before the end of the 2022, to clean/organize, and to embrace the cooler, delightful weather and fall colors.

Maybe it is time to revamp your morning routine and time with God. You could designate 10 minutes each morning for prayer. Set up a table with your Bible, your journal, and other spiritual readings. I found a new candle to light for my quiet time with God.

What will you pray for and about this fall? Here is a prayer for students written by Aaron Meis. Join me in lifting up these words throughout the school year.

October 1 & 2 17th Weekend after Pentecost

Receive them with thanksgiving.

October 8 & 9 18th weekend after Pentecost

It's a miracle! Multiple miracles! The waters of holy baptism have healed us. The body and blood of Jesus in holy communion have made us clean. We have died with Christ and been raised with him. For all this we have returned to offer thanks. From this place we are sent on our way rejoicing to share the good news.

October 15 & 16 19th weekend after Pentecost

Pray always. Do not lose heart. This is Christ's encouragement in the gospel today. Wrestle with the word. Remember your baptism again and again. Come regularly to Christ's table. Persistence in our every encounter with the divine will be blessed.

October 22 & 23 20th weekend after Pentecost

Genuine repentance and pretentious piety stand in stark contrast in the gospel and all around us. All creation stands in need of God's forgiveness. Keep the faith. God's people shall be accounted righteous for Jesus' sake. Our God is merciful to sinners. For this we worship and glorify God forever.

October 29 & 30 Reformation Weekend

"God loves us all, both big and small," a child's verse declares. The sins of the world are covered. We are able to stand tall before God our righteous judge because in the person of Jesus "salvation has come to this house"—to our house today. In Christ Jesus God seeks us out to save us.

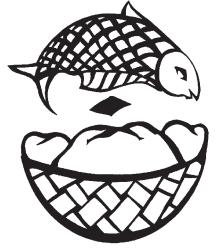
Mission Quilters
